RAMP AT SCRATBY (BEACH ACCESS)



The ramp at the beach access in Scratby has been a huge success allowing people to get down to the beach more easily. However, due to land sliding down the banks, improvements are now required to secure the banks which have suffered due to material coming loose and falling onto the path.

We are looking at different methods but could include a retaining wall, marram grass and netting.

We are currently obtaining quotes and expect this work to start in the new year and will see the ramp closed for approx. 2 weeks.

We will notify residents in advance of these works taking place.

SAFETY UPDATE

SAM2 Speed Camera

You will have noticed the SAM2 cameras located around the villages. The cameras gather data on traffic that passes through our villages. It records every vehicle that passes through with speed recorded and the time of day.

On the 17th October, the camera was located on Station Road, Ormesby facing the oncoming traffic from Scratby Road towards the village. The data below is based on dates between 17th October to 16th November.

- A total of 20,840 vehicles travelled towards the village.
- There were 3,451 cars travelling over 30 mph of which 690 were in excess of 35 mph.
