



YOUR PARISH NEEDS YOU!

If you care about your community and want to help shape its future, consider becoming a parish councillor. No special experience is needed, just a willingness to get involved.

What does the parish council do?

It looks after local facilities and speaks up for residents.

The parish council manages assets such as the recreation ground, parish halls, allotments, burial ground and woodland, handling things like grass cutting, building upkeep, public toilets, trees and bus shelters.

It represents local views on planning, roads and community safety, is consulted on planning applications, and works with the police and other organisations to get things done.

The parish council does not have control over public highways (roads and pavements), but raises residents' concerns with the county council, which is responsible.

Councillors decide priorities, set budgets and make sure public money is spent carefully, for the benefit of the community.
